PUBLIC HEARING, SPECIAL & REGULAR BOARD MEETING
Minutes of November 16th, 2021

The meeting was brought to order on November 16th, 2021 at 6:00pm at the Fifield Town Hall

ROLL CALL: Present: W. Felch, B. Salm, J.Hintz. Also present S. Mueller, T. Fleming and 10 others. Verification of public posting and legal ad confirmed; the Pledge of Allegiance was recited

PUBLIC COMMENT REQUESTS: One resident was heard regarding:

A request of the board to consider paving Brahmstadt Rd with possible funds coming available through the recently passed infrastructure package. Comments were taken into consideration for the future five year plan, and the board acknowledged it will be part of the road tour in spring of 2022.

PUBLIC HEARING – There were no questions, inquiries or opposition from residents regarding the Proposed 2022 Budget

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE ELECTORS – Residents approved the following:

Motions made by B.Lobermeier and M.Langenhahn to accept the Town Levy payable in 2022 of \$268,444.00 (VV11-0)

Motions made by T.Fleming and D.Lapp to accept the Fire Department #1 Tax Levy payable in 2022 of \$106,909.00 (VV 6-0)

Motions made by R.Sironi and M.Ida to accept the Fire Department #2 Tax Levy payable in 2022 of \$69,004.00 (VV 5-0)

A MOTION called by the Town chair to accept and adopt the 2022 Budget and the Levy's of the Special Meeting, MOTION made by J.Hintz and B.Salm, motion carried (VV 3-0)

MINUTES OF OCTOBER BOARD MEETINGS: A MOTION was made by B.Salm and J.Hintz to approve the minutes of the October board meetings; Motion carried, (VV 3-0)

CLERK/TREASURER: Treasurers Financial Report was reviewed and accepted

CEMETERY REPORT: Written report was reviewed and accepted

OLD SCHOOL PROPERTY UPDATE: A realtor is working up a proposal for the sale to be presented at a future meeting prior to listing. It is the intent to sell for purposes of a future development contract.

CONNECT COMMUNITIES PRESENTATION: A presentation by L.Ludwig regarding the Town of Fifield being recently accepted into the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation's "Main Street" program. Residents are needed to join a committee to give information and feedback on projects that will assist in the Price County group of communities to promote the area, this will potentially lead to possible grants of economic improvement. Information will be posted and promoted to recruit individuals.

PIKE LAKE CHAIN ORDINANCE #28 UPDATE: The DNR has returned a letter with requirements regarding the changes presented for the existing ordinance update. It was determined these items needed were extensive to make the change. It was discussed that the most economical way to address the concern was to leave the current ordinance in place and simply update the signage on the lake and at boat landings. Wording of the sign and requirements will be sent back to the DNR for approval and regulations. Cost will be determined and this will be brought back to a future meeting for considerations.

TOWN CREW REPORT : Superintendent T.Fleming reported the following:

Cy's Drive culverts have been done, N.Boruta Rd has been completed, Gates and Riley roads culverts completed, winter sand was ordered.

Information was requested regarding N.Boruta Rd for the Superintendent to compile on previous years work records to provide to the Board Chairman for 2022 project work with the Town of Eisenstein.

TRANSFER SITES REPORT: T.Fleming had no major issues to report

Fire #2 Reported: One EMS call

Storage Shed Agreement: The agreement was read, approved, and signed for the sharing of the storage shed by the Fire Dept#2 and the Sno Drivers Club.
